We are pleased to present you with the Annual Education Report (AER) which provides key information on the 2022-2023 educational progress Bay City Academy. The AER addresses the complex reporting information required by federal and state laws. The school's report contains information about student assessment, accountability, and teacher quality. For the 2023-24 school year, schools were identified using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup in 2022-2023. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Our school was not given one of these labels.

Bay City Academy continues to improve in its academic performance. Staff has worked diligently to improve academic performance, school culture and discipline procedures. We are focusing on two initiatives this year; truancy and "Don't Wish for It Work For It." Coming out of Covid the last couple of school years we have found that school attendance became optional for many families. If a student is not present in school they can't learn. We designated a staff member to become our truancy coordinator. She proactively reaches out to our families concerning school attendance, sends truancy letters and coordinates truancy meetings. Our second initiative, "Don't Wish for It Work For It" begins working with our students in the 8th grade to make sure they have a post-secondary path. These paths include college, the trades or enlistment in the United States military. The newly created position of College and Career Counselor is responsible for facilitating this program.

Bay City Academy is a tuition-free public-school academy serving the Bay City Community. Bay City Academy enrollment is open to all Michigan residents.

The School Improvement committee continues to meet and work on the MICIP school improvement plan throughout the year. The committee is made up of a variety of staff members, Bay Arenac Intermediate School District members, community members and parents. These team meets three times a year to discuss our student improvement plan and make sure we are implementing the plan in our school. We continually conduct stakeholder surveys, discuss goals and objectives, analyze data and evaluate growth based on our student improvement plan.

In addition to core instruction, Bay City Academy offers instruction in Musical Theatre, Art, Classroom Music, Physical Education, Character Education and Finance. We also offer a full- scale athletics program.
